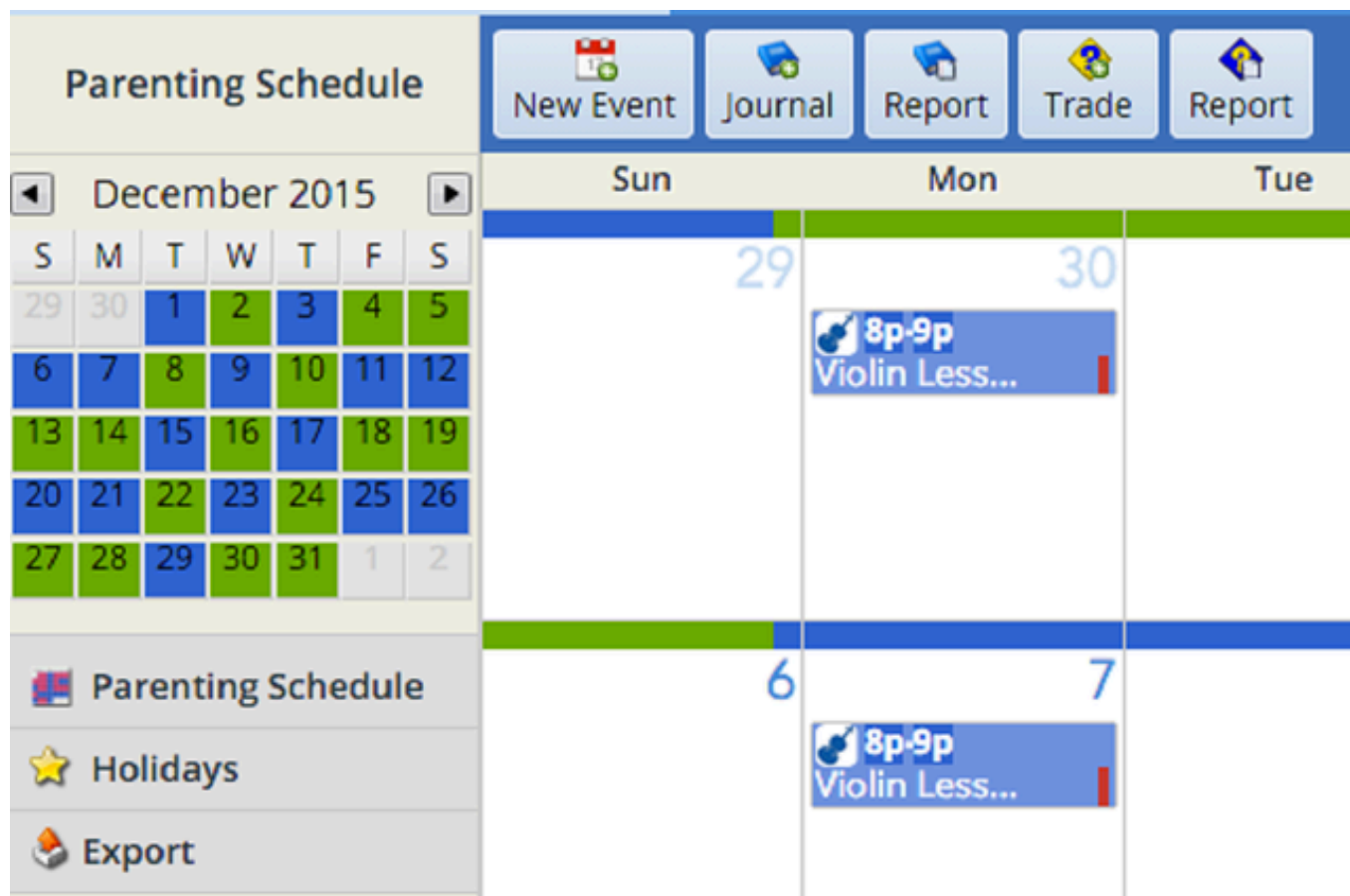
Brad Pitt and Angelina Jolie have finally reached a custody agreement for their six children, after separating two years ago.
